How has planning changed since the last draft Local Plan fell upon Sturminster Marshall in 2021?

With a new 15-year Dorset-wide Local Plan being drafted, and a consultation coming this August, I thought it timely to think about how planning has changed since the last consultation in 2021. Note that this is not about the Neighbourhood Plan agreed last year.

Much more land is said to be needed now The Government has introduced a new compulsory housing target for Dorset, rising from 1,793 annually in the last draft Plan to 3,246 new homes each year now.

Grey Belt rather than Green The protection of the land surrounding the Village under Green Belt policy has reduced. To qualify for protection land must now contribute strongly to at least one of three Green Belt purposes:

- preventing the unrestricted sprawl of large built-up areas
- preventing neighbouring towns from merging
- preserving the setting and special character of historic towns.

Villages play no role in these particular purposes, so all the land surrounding Sturminster Marshall can be considered now by developers to be Grey Belt rather than Green Belt. Until recently Green Belt policy meant that development surrounding the Village was deemed to be *inappropriate*: this is no longer true.

There are policy caveats though. High quality agricultural land is still valued; and existing sports and recreational land should not be built on unless surplus to requirements or being replaced by at least equivalent provision. Policy affects development in other ways too:

Golden Rules Land taken out of the Green/Grey Belt must be developed according to the so-called Golden Rules. These require as much as 50% of the homes to be affordable (although developers often argue back that such a high ratio is not viable financially for them). Such development must also improve infrastructure and public access to green space.

Sustainable Developments must still be in *sustainable* locations. Significant development should be focused on locations where there is a limited need to travel and a genuine choice of transport modes. A larger town like Dorchester offers most services and facilities within walking or cycling distance, and people there can use buses and trains as well as cars. Sturminster Marshall is categorically different. We are fortunate to have shops, a pharmacy, a first school, a limited bus service and a pub, but we have to travel by car to access health services, supermarkets and the rest. In terms of being a sustainable location we are more sustainable than, say, Shapwick, but much less than Dorchester.

Character Development should respect and maintain the prevailing *character* of each area. This is nebulous, but it's clear to me that Sturminster Marshall has a characteristic mix of people and institutions, old and new homes, and businesses that work well. There are a greater proportion of people of working age here than in Dorset as a whole, and slightly more young people too. The Village would benefit from a steady flow of new homes, especially homes that would be affordable to local young people and key workers – research for the Neighbourhood Plan arrived at a suggested figure of 10 new homes per year. However, the last draft Local Plan proposed building nearly **500** new homes in the Village over 17 years – nearer 30 per year – and many Villagers thought that excessive in their replies to Dorset Council's consultation.

Another consultation Dorset Council has resurrected the bones of the 2021 draft Local Plan and is putting out another consultation this August. Probably we will be asked again what we think about proposed developments surrounding the Village. Last time a small group of villagers organised a simple on-line survey of opinions about the sites proposed. That resulted in an emailing list to spread information and the formation of a loose unincorporated association called "Just a Good Village". 

Morshead Trophy Award 2025

Sturminster Marshall the Historic Church Fundraiser of the Year

Dorset Historic Churches Trust is delighted to award the Morshead Trophy for the best fundraising parish of the year to St Mary, Sturminster Marshall. They raised nearly £5,000 in the Ride+Stride sponsored event in 2024 – an amazing result from a village of about two thousand inhabitants.



David Grant, the Chair of the Trust, presented the trophy to the church's Treasurer, Edward Warren, at a gathering in The Old School attended by a large number of supporters including the vicar, Revd Jane Williams. David said that Sturminster Marshall were very worthy winners of the Trophy and had made a significant contribution to the total raised across 132 participating parishes in Dorset of over £104.000.

Mr Warren thanked the Trust for this award and emphasised that it rewarded a

large number of people who staffed the church on Ride+Stride day, made refreshments for participants and supported riders and striders, as well as actually raising sponsorship themselves.

The cash raised is used to make grants to churches in Dorset which are in need of repair – mainly to roofs and walls to keep out the rain. 50% of the money raised by each parish is returned direct to them, but the Trust has still made grants of £1.16 million in the last 10 years. These can be decisive in funding repairs, as each church has to find the money itself to carry out increasingly expensive restoration work.

Parishioners had prepared very generous and tasty refreshments for the event, which together with a sunny evening made a happy celebration of the presentation.



Kingston Lacy Estate News

The hot, dry weather has been challenging gardeners and rangers across Kingston Lacy. On property, the garden team have been laying plans for climate change for some years; planting has changed to focus more on wildflowers and less on formal bedding, with areas left unmown and a lot of mulching on borders throughout the year to conserve moisture in the ground.

Out on the estate, grazing plans are being kept flexible to ensure the right number of animals on the right areas of land – you'll see sheep up at Badbury Rings in August, but this year there are no plans to move cattle on to the site.



At property, all staff are gearing up for the main summer event, this year happening in the Kitchen Garden. There's a whole fiesta of fun, with lots of different play equipment free to use (normal admission applies) for as long as you like, and a calendar of different pop up events throughout July and August. There are craft activities, dance parties, yoga classes, circus workshops with Jamie Jigsaw and bubble play with Squidge and Pop, not to mention activities with the garden and ranger teams such as seed planting

and nature walks.

Looking ahead to the autumn, we'll be hosting a wonderful new exhibition called Meet Rembrandt, with a self-portrait that normally lives at Buckland Abbey on display here at Kingston Lacy. There'll be lots more to come on this, which will be tapping into a current trend at museums and galleries for "slow looking", which encourages visitors to take more time over individual works of art.

And finally – yes, it's early but the bookings have opened for Storytelling with Santa, the popular December event for children at Kingston Lacy. It might seem too early, but it gives families the chance to spread the cost of what is often a very expensive time of year.





Picnic time!

The warm weather makes us all want to eat outside and many families head for the beach with their picnic. Once reserved for wealthy landowners to enjoy on their estates, the Victorians revolutionised the phenomenon of outdoor dining, bringing the picnic to the masses and paving the way for every family to enjoy taking their meals outside.

And the Victorians certainly knew how to picnic. Meat and fish played a large part in the Victorian picnic. In fact, for a party of 40 people, Mrs Beeton recommends "a joint of cold roast beef, a joint of cold boiled beef, 2 ribs of lamb, 2 shoulders of lamb, 4 roast fowls, 2 roast ducks, 1 ham, 1 tongue" and more. Also on the menu would be fresh pies, perhaps veal or pigeon.



Far from dainty triangular affairs, sandwiches were intended to satisfy even the hungriest of children. A picnic sandwich for most families would be a substantial pairing of thick-cut whole wheat bread with fillings of salted meat and salad such as cress, lettuce or celery. Cheese was also a popular filling, often grated and mixed with cream or chopped nuts. The sandwich was a wholesome feast.

No proper Victorian picnic was complete without a few sweet treats and desserts thrown in for good measure. Baskets would often be filled to the brim with fruit turnovers, cheesecakes, 'cabinet' or sweet steamed puddings, blancmanges and jam puffs.

Thirsts also need quenching on a hot summer's day, and Mrs Beeton tells us that "bottles of ale, ginger-beer, soda-water, and lemonade" were regular fare. Also suggested are sherry, and brandy for the grown-ups, not to mention plenty of tea.

Think of the Victorians as you dust off the sand from your sandwich and rummage through the cool bag for a can of pop.







Buddlejas come in a nice range of colours, white, pink, pink-to- crimson, lilac to mauve, blue- purple, purple and deep violet, but I do wish they had a sweeter scent. Sadly, buddleja flowers smell strongly though not nicely of tom-cats in the prime of life and if you pick them for indoors, discerning visitors will sniff and say 'What is it I can smell?' and when you tell them, they usually say, 'Well, then, they're best left outside, aren't they?'

No answer to that one.

So, plant-breeders! Get cracking and produce a really sweet-scented Buddleja. And, dear plant-breeders, I'm sorry if I've said anything to upset you in the past. You do have your (vital) place in the scheme of things.



Coping with the heat?

I expect that most of us have found the extremely hot days we have had this summer somewhat difficult to cope with. Not only during the day, but sleeping at night is almost impossible. And we are not the only living things on the planet that are finding climate change a challenge. Spring has been getting earlier for 30 years and more. 'Is that a problem?' I hear you say. Shorter winters might be nice! Unfortunately, there are many species of plants, insects, birds, fish and animals that are finding it a huge problem. Some species have been able to adapt to our changing climate but some are reaching the limits of the adaptability.

Take the blue tit, for example: while raising young chicks, blue tits must find a staggering 1,000 caterpillars each day. To satisfy the demanding appetite of their offspring, it is essential that parent birds time their breeding to coincide with the spring peak in caterpillar



abundance. But warmer temperatures mean that oak trees leaf earlier, meaning that caterpillars may peak in numbers before young chicks have hatched, meaning many blue tit chicks could face starvation. Similar trends are affecting many of our best-loved woodland birds, from pied flycatchers to great tits.

Are we too late to stop this disaster? Scientists predict that if we do nothing, by 2030 we will pass the point of no return. So we need to act now to avoid or limit some of the worst effects of climate change.

Responding to climate change will involve a two-tier approach: Mitigation and Adaptation

We can all do our bit. We can walk or use public transport, say 'no' to single-use plastic, reduce food waste and turn off electrical appliances when not in use. We can adapt our diet, buy local, use refillables and renewables, and grow vegetables and drought-tolerant plants in our gardens. Together we can save our planet.
