



Nature's Voice

I find it funny to reflect on how my perspective of the natural world has changed since having children. Their interest in nature has meant I've had to learn 'on the job,' and as a consequence, I notice so much more. It really is true that it only takes knowing the name of something to make you then spot it everywhere. I think it's a pretty fundamental human phenomenon – we like to name things – and naming it, as if by magic, gives it a place in our world.

This summer, the learning about moths and butterflies I had to do last year has meant I've spotted the timeline of species on this rotation of the seasons. Where I would once have just noticed 'lots of butterflies,' this time I noted that the marbled whites and skippers were king of the grassland a few weeks




ago, to be overtaken by 6 spot burnet moths more recently.

Now that I know what the cocoons of the 6 spot burnet moths look like (after a happy experiment conducted last summer by the then 8 year old) I can see them all over Badbury, clinging to the grass like little seeds. Some are still plump, but most are now empty, with a dark shell of the insect's previous form left behind on the exit. The moths themselves look unreal with their brightness - there are just so many of them. You can spot them by their bright red colour, crazily clashing against the purple thistles and, of course, by their 6 spots.

It doesn't take any formal

schooling to understand and appreciate the nature all around, it only takes someone to point it out to you – most of my knowledge has come from those under 10 years old! So next time you're out and about, have a look for the 6 spot burnet moth... or if you have already made friends with them, be brave and point them out to a passer-by. You might just give them a new lens to view the world through.



Well, here we go again! Another month gone, it seems only yesterday that I was writing for the May magazine. So here we are, and I am writing about the Wimborne Youth club which I taught at.

This was started in the Wimborne Methodist church the club but sadly closed in 2004. I don't know when it started but I think it was when the Methodist church was built, but I was working it with the young people until it closed. There was a place before that which was open during the week with different people using the church. I decided to go back to the club 'when my two older boys decided to go to the club. Gordon would drive in and pick them up until I passed my driving test, then I would take them. Just after that the boys asked if I could help at the junior club with the nine to fourteen year olds and that was the start of a long and lovely time, working with the young people.

Each night was catered for the youngsters and Monday and Friday were for the senior club of fourteen to eighteen, and Tuesday was for an all age group for those with speech difficulties. I started behind the bar. Wednesday was the youth club, Thursday for the Methodist church only and Friday night was Disco night and I would do the door, getting them to sign in and paying £I to get in. They loved this! As they came down the stairs we would then have a lovely talk at the bottom, of all the things that young people did. I did love the Wednesday nights with the chats and my children helping with the discos.

The Youth club closed in 2004 as the church wanted to do different things. Friday afternoon it became used by the Beaucroft school in Colehill so it was used for the children. There were many happy times there and all the children were safe. I think that it was then that started at the Allendale but it did not go on for long as there was no room for the pool and snooker tables. A shame but that is how it grew. I don't miss the contact but life goes on and throws things at you and you can sink or swim, and that is another chapter!



Kingston Lacy Estate News

Habitat creation work at Bishops Court Farm

Expect to see contractors and rangers hard at work at Bishops Court Farm at Shapwick in the next few months, as we begin to implement plans to create two key habitats: species-rich grassland and wood pasture.

The former dairy farm, which came back into National Trust management in 2020, is at the start of a decade-long participation in Countryside Stewardship, a government-funded scheme that works to protect and improve the natural environment. It is an important part of wider plans to develop a bio-diverse, resilient setting for wildlife across the whole of the Kingston Lacy estate.

At Bishops Court Farm, three fields will be sown with chalk grassland seed collected from local grasslands, while one will be allowed to regenerate naturally. Next summer should see a much wider variety of species flourishing, with flowers such as yellow rattle, scabious, salad burnet and wild thyme and fine grasses such as quaking and meadow oat grass, and swathes of open grassland that are perfect for birds, bumblebees, butterflies, bats and more.

The wood pasture will see more than 2,700 shrubs and trees planted from November to create an open canopy woodland where livestock will graze within the next few years. Species will include beech, field maple, dogwood and buckthorn, initially planted in fenced off areas to allow the whips to establish without being nibbled by the deer. A perimeter fence and installation of new water pipes and troughs will help us graze the area with Kingston Lacy's pedigree Red Ruby Devon cattle, a hardy breed that is perfect for conservation grazing.

This restoration of a healthier natural environment is part of initiatives to link up habitats across the estate, creating a network of habitat "corridors" that will prevent species becoming isolated in a particular location. Hedgerows at Bishops Court Farm have been allowed to thicken and develop since the land came back in hand in 2020, increasing both food and shelter for birds, insects and mammals. In the spring rangers planted more than 500m of hedging across the whole of the estate, helping to plug gaps and create species-rich hedgerows. This follows the planting of more than 5,000 trees at Kingston Lacy in 2021, contributing to the Trust's national aim to plant 20 million trees by 2023. This time last year when I wrote it was sweltering hot, and from what Europe is experiencing at the moment we could be on for another hot period of weather. However, at the moment it is particularly British with changeable sunny and rainy weather. Just as a reminder, there is no Parish Council Meeting in August, the next meeting is on Thursday 7th September.

The 20mph meeting was well supported, and member of Dorset Council Highways team came along and talked about the process and then took questions. Robin Cook our Dorset Councillor was also present. Some volunteers came forward at the end of the meeting and gave their email addresses and offered to help. We have contacted them, but as I write not enough people have come forward to take this process any further. If you are able and willing to help with this process, please contact Alison the Parish Clerk on the above email address.

We have been spending a lot of Parish funds on maintaining the play area and we are waiting for a quote from Dorset Council for refurbishing the areas under some equipment. We are also looking at replacing the safety signs. We recently put a new backboard and net on the basketball equipment. Unfortunately, some youngsters have been climbing on to this equipment, this is not allowed and has caused a great deal of concern for their safety.

I have been walking around the village in recent weeks, and there are a lot of brambles and hedges overhanging footpaths / pavements, please trim them. It is not nice, especially when it is getting dark if you walk into one and could cause serious injury. As always other parish maintenance is ongoing, including cleaning of the village war memorials, repairs to village benches. and we are getting quotes for a new Parish Noticeboard at Maypole Green.

As I write Southern Gas Networks are proposing to shut the A350 at Blandford St. Mary, starting on the 5th August and it is expected to last 3 weeks. This will mean increased pressure on village roads, so please be on your guard. Our Dorset Councillor has raised concerns regarding 'rat running' through rural roads of Sturminster Marshall and Shapwick. We will post any information regarding this closure on the Parish website mentioned at the top of the jottings.

The Neighbourhood Plan Pre-submission consultation has now finished and we are on to the next step. The steering group will be analysing the completed questionnaires that have been returned, and possibly making changes if required.



Some .like it hot* by Lys de Bray

Tulips are my favourite flower. They are generally associated with Holland, and I have always considered Dutch people to have their sabots firmly on the ground and as a race they are not given to whimsy. However, the story of Tulipomania isn't a tale of whimsy but one of greed, politics and villainy and I shall be telling you about it in my next article.

In one of my reference books I saw a picture of a blue and white Delft tulip vase; it had eight individual vases spouting Ilium the sides like teapot spouts in which to put single tulips with a leaf, four at each side and two or three buds/flowers at the top. Seen from the front it was eye-catching and totally formal, and one could easily imagine the separate blooms opening from buds to wide- open flowers in such a vase and I got the wants immediately! The use of this kind of vase need not be restricted to tulips, daffs and narcissus or any stiff-stemmed upright flower would be good. Were I younger I would ask a a potter to make some for me (I think it would be *really* difficult) and I'd go to Chelsea and/or other big flower shows and start a new? fashion. My tulip-vase would be in a plain 'quiet' colour with a matt surface (unlike the old Delft china ones which were wildly patterned and glossy). Maybe vases like this exist but I think it unlikely as today's flower arrangements are generally loose and graceful. Some tulips have big, heavy flowers, so their vase should be sturdy and weighty enough at the base to compensate for this.

August/September is the time to plant tulips, choose a dry, sunny day and always check the planting depth. There are tulips to suit every sunny place in the garden and next month I'll give you a list of suggestions.

And lastly, as I'm sure you'll know, if you take ripened seed from a <u>cultivated</u> flower, you won't get a lookalike, you may get something, or nothing If you are curious you could scatter some ripe seed thinly in a sunny corner, mark the spot and see what happens (and don't forget to give the patch a drink now and then).

Alexandre Dumas (1802-1870) wrote a story called 'The Black Tulip' and I'm rereading it as I often do at tulip-planting time. I was given a delightful old copy which has excellent illustrations of the clothes and furnishings of the period, and there is a paperback edition,** more comfortable to read in bed as the other is heavy enough to cave your ribs in.

And, lastly, Dutch growers export two billion tulip bulbs annually.


