From The Church Matthew 5:9

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

As I write this article, I am sat in our twice-yearly Marriage Preparation sessions which we hold on Zoom nowadays. To see all the couples full of love and expectancy is a real blessing. One thing we warn them is that there will be days to come when life is hard. It is on these occasions that when the surface of emotions is scratched one partner may be easily angered or hurt. At the moment, as I move around the community and observe our common life lived together, I see frustration, anger and hurt which are happening far too easily. I suspect this is the impact of long periods of stress, huge work demands, and rising costs of living. Not only are we and our neighbours struggling of course but also our institutions and organisations also. And then we look at the middle East and see the result of unresolved conflict. Our hearts break just as God's heart breaks. Unsure how to help other than to pray.

It perhaps makes us even more aware how blessed are the peacekeepers (as our title reads today). We think perhaps of those who help make the peace within our families or neighbourhoods as well as those who are professional peacekeepers such as those working for the United Nations. It takes a certain skill set to be able to bring peace in the middle of conflict and can be very dangerous. (As Christians we know we can turn to Jesus, the Prince of Peace, and seek his presence in such situations and moments and seek his help, patience, and presence).

This month we mark Remembrance once again. We remember the lives given up in conflicts that were not their own yet fought them nonetheless because they were asked to, were expected to, and believed it to be right. We hear in John 15.13 that "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." {To give your life for friends is a mighty act of love, how much more powerful is it when we think about those who gave their lives and didn't know us. (None more so of course than Jesus).)

So, this November let us come together and be thankful for what others gave up for us and may that motivate us to seek and maintain peace in our own lives.







Kingston Lacy Estate News

Will you help us plant the future?

November brings an exciting collaboration between Kingston Lacy and Trees for Dorset, and we'd love you to get involved on Saturday 18 November.



That's when we'll be planting 96 oak trees in Shapwick to commemorate the life of the late Queen Elizabeth. The trees have been supplied by Trees for Dorset, a local charity working to plant more trees in the county.

Trees are an important part of the National Trust's ambitions; it has set a goal to plant 20m trees by 2023

across the UK. Here in this corner of Dorset we are contributing to that through extensive planting at Abbott Street copse in 2019, more than 5,000 trees planted in 2021 (at The Down, White Mill and Bear Wood) and a further 9,000 planned for 2024.

This collaboration is a little different. The bulk of our planting on the Kingston Lacy estate has been designed to lock up carbon and for the benefit of wildlife, aiming to restore rare habitats, boost diversity and mitigate the effects of intensive farming. This means that a variety of trees are planted, from hazel and wild cherry to willow and alder, to develop naturalistic woodland habitat that is used for grazing or to help reduce surface water and arable pollution run-off.

The woodland created with Trees for Dorset will be solely oaks, but they themselves will bring many benefits. Renowned in history and legend, oak trees symbolise royalty, patriotism and strength. But alongside this they are a haven for wildlife, supporting 2,300 species by providing a place to eat, shelter and breed. Over time we are looking to extend the woodland with other species, providing an amenity for the local community and visitors to Shapwick.

Join staff and volunteers from both the National Trust and Trees for Dorset on Saturday 18 November to plant the future. Come along at 10.30am – follow signage from The Old School Nursery and please wear appropriate clothing, including gardening gloves. Other equipment will be provided.

The range of activities were immense, including some perhaps lesser known ones such as dog walking, witness support service, reminiscence outreach, and young persons' bereavement counselling.

Of course we only saw the winners from those nominated and there will be hundreds, maybe thousands more, who go about helping their chosen cause unrecognised but that in no way devalues their contribution to society.

It certainly re-enforces something that was said to me many years ago by a newcomer to Wimborne whose comment was, I quote "Wimborne is run by volunteers – and there are hundreds of them!". I am now convinced that this is true all over the county.

The PCC had wanted to introduce this scheme for a while, so seeing it come to fruition is really pleasing. Having mounted rural volunteers will help further connect the Dorset Police Rural Crime Team with the communities they serve as well as offer a unique vantage point that will not only gather intelligence that may have been missed by standard patrols but improve visibility within our rural communities.

He said 'I look forward to seeing the scheme expand and encourage anyone with a horse who wants to support police in their communities to get involved. This is just one more weapon in the armoury when it comes to taking the fight to the criminals who plague our countryside'.

Last year when I was writing the November Jottings it was raining, this year it is showery and sunny but with a threat of cooler temperatures in the coming days and even a frost. Hopefully by the time you read this you will have put all your tender plants safely away for the winter.

The Parish Council have been informed that Dorset Council would like to progress the EV Charge point at Sturminster Marshall which is good news. The next step is a meeting between Dorset Council and the Chairman of the Memorial Hall.

A Youth Club has been started in the village at the Memorial Hall on Monday evenings and it is being run by youth leaders from Dorset Youth Association and helpers. 



Much later on when I had more time and sense and was better organised, I might have conducted an interesting experiment. I'd have bought sufficient bulbs and on arrival I'd have divided them into groups; Group one to be planted at the right time, Group two one month later and Group three one month later still and so on. The really late-planted bulbs would have flowered, eventually, but they'll be unhappy and they'll tell you so.

You won't be able to get much/anything in the way of bulbs when you read this, so these suggestions are for next year- think about them now, make a wish-list from the catalogues and send it to the bulb supplier/grower who will love you for thinking to 'Plant Early for Spring' (which will be 2025) Doesn't bear thinking of now, does it? But you'll be so glad you did. By sending early you'll be almost certain to get what you want instead of reading or hearing 'Sorry, sold out'. The arrival of the bulbs at the right time will make you plant them at the right time - providing you're not on holiday in Patagonia or Polzeath. So, let's start with daffs, by which I mean daffodils and narcissus. If you've got the space, like an old orchard, think of the little wild ones, Narcissus pseudo-Narcissus which will increase from year to year, needing only to be left alone, like the film star Greta Garbo who was famous for saying I vant to be alone:

Brilliant blue Grape Hyacinths might be planted in front of or with dwarf pale pink tulips such as 'Pink Prince' or the lilac tulip 'Candy Prince' Other companions could be crocus, scilla, muscari, grape hyacinth, hyacinth (not the same) Snowdrop - *Galanthus*, Snowflake - *Leucojum*, Iris *reticulata*, and Winter aconite - *Eranthis cilicica* or *E. hyemalis*. When the spring bulbs have *completely* finished flowering, lift them carefully with their earth and re-plant in a spare corner of the garden to finish their job and go to sleep until planting time comes round again, and don't forget to mark their resting place.

There's no peace in a garden, whatever made you think there was?
