

From The Church

On 5th July 1948, the NHS was born. A healthcare system "free at the point of delivery". A service for all people from 'cradle to the grave'.

75 years on, we are still privileged to receive this care. So often we hear of the negative elements of the service, especially over more recent years; the lack of staff, the delay in treatments and so the list goes on.

Since September, I have been privileged to be working as a hospital chaplain. In this role, I have witnessed first hand the care that is provided from the nurse, doctors, cleaners and admin – of which without, there would not be any system in place. I have seen the conscientiousness, the frustrations, the weariness of all the staff and yet, I have also heard the gratefulness of the patients and families. I have arrived on call at night and seen 12 ambulances queuing for A & E, the overflowing waiting room, the shortage of beds, and yet, amidst the hustle and bustle, there is an undercurrent of love and care for all those that come through the doors.

Jesus tells us to "love our neighbour as yourself" (Mark 12:31), and on more than one occasion I have heard staff say, 'that could be my relative'. A wonderful example of the empathy in the care that is given.

What I have seen in the last six months is something of 'doing the best in a given situation', something that may ring true to many of us. In a hospital with 4500 staff and 450 beds, this place is a mini town in itself, where people of all cultures, faith or no faith come whether to work or be cared for. This well-known healthcare service free at the point of delivery is open to all regardless of faith, sexuality, gender, culture. In chaplaincy, we move away from the medical model into the spiritual, recognising that every individual is a spiritual being. Through pastoral and spiritual care, we aim to meet people where they are and travel some of that journey with them.

Jesus, too, in travelling from town to town stopped, listened, healed, and talked with the people around him, welcoming them 'in'. As he says at the beginning of his ministry, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free" (Luke 4:18).

I am so grateful for all the people I meet on a daily basis in the hospital and in the villages, who share their stories and teach me so much.

Nature's Voice



Writing this in February half-term, it really feels like spring is just around the corner. We visited Kimmeridge Bay today, for a sunny picnic, and found ourselves overdressed in winter woollies! It turned out to be quite the safari, with my son counting 16 buzzards on the route, clearly making the most of the thermals. He's also convinced he saw an osprey. We have learnt that he's usually right - so maybe he did. My daughter saw a herd of deer and I spotted a weasel disappearing into a hedge!

All over the garden, the bulbs are peeking out of the soil, reminding us that the world will be colourful once again soon. T here's a very neat row of garlic coming up - which was a surprise as I planted them last year but the tops ended up being 'slugged' and so they never came to anything. They're clearly having a second run!

If you look out, you might spot an early

butterfly. Some species over-winter as adults, hibernating somewhere safe and warm, like a shed. These are the first you'll see out and about and they can look a little past their best as a result of their winter sleep. We spotted a brimstone, butter-yellow and flapping crazily over the garden just today. Others to look for are commas, with their raggedy wings, small tortoiseshells, red admirals and peacocks.

I love this time of year when you can look for hints of spring, the air smells fresh and feels chilly, but the sun is starting to feel warm on your face. I hope you see some heralds of spring on your walk or run, through your window or out on your garden bench.







Kingston Lacy Estate News

The wide open spaces at Badbury Rings are a much loved spot for dog walkers. But the Rings are also used for many other purposes – we have been grazing Badbury since September with sheep, which helps keep the chalk grassland open and free of scrub and invasive grass species so that the wildflowers can flourish.

For most of this time the sheep have been restricted to the lower section, but we have moved their block closer to the Rings to provide new grazing. This move, however, has resulted in a few issues – loose dogs have resulted in the sheep being chased out of their pen on several occasions. These are pregnant ewes, so excessive worrying may result in some abortion of lambs.



We understand that not everyone realises how important it is to keep dogs on a lead. So we'd be grateful for your help: even if your dog is impeccably trained, sticking to the rules ensures other people don't copy your behaviour. We'd also be grateful to receive a call if you see anything concerning – the telephone numbers are on posters at the site and we're always available if you see a problem.

It's not just the sheep that benefit from our 'dogs on lead' policy. As the breeding season starts, birds such as skylarks, corn bunting and lapwings – all in critical decline – will be nesting in open grassland such as Badbury Rings, as well as farmland and heathland at Holt Heath.

Sometimes birds can nest very close

to paths in the vegetation and are prone to disturbance by people walking off the paths or by dogs exploring.

If your dog goes into the vegetation it may flush a bird from the nest, leaving eggs or chicks exposed and vulnerable to chilling or to attack from predators. Your dog might also stop adults feeding or taking food to their young, or cause birds to abandon a good nesting site.

Our aim, as always, is to increase your enjoyment of this special place by maintaining and increasing what Badbury offers. With your help we can ensure this site remains well loved for future generations.

English Usage by Michael Evans

Meanings and sounds, continued from last month - Onomatopoeia

The word onomatopoeia comes from the Greek *onoma* (word) and *poiein* (to make) so it means "word making." Unlike most words, onomatopoeic ones have been invented, in an attempt to imitate sounds made by people, things or nature.

Here are some examples:

atishoo, bam, bang, bong, boing, boom, choo-choo, clang, cuckoo, ding-dong, ping-pong, slap, splash, twang, tweet, whirr, whoosh, woof, zoom.

All languages include onomatopoeic words, but don't expect them to sound like the English ones.

In French, for example, cock-a-doodle-do is cocorico; quack-quack is coin-coin (pronounced nasally kwa-kwa); atishoo is atchoum.; purr is ron-ron, and the lovely sound when you pour a glass of wine, glug-glug, is glou-glou.





Fruit may be preserved from birds by a somewhat singular expedient, namely, the employment of CATS .


R Brooke, Esq. of Melton Lodge, Suffolk, pursued the plan for several years with the most perfect success.

He had four or five cats, each with a collar, and light chain and swivel, about a yard long, with a large iron ring at the end; as soon as the gooseberries, currants and raspberries began to ripen, a small stake was driven into the ground, or be near to the trees to be protected leaving about a yard and a half of the stake above ground; the ring was slipped over the head of the stake, and the cat, thus tethered in sight of the trees; no bird would approach them.

Cherry trees and wall-fruit trees were protected in the same manner as they successively ripened.

Each cat, by way of a shed had one of the largest-sized flower pots, laid on its side, within reach of her chain, with a little hay or straw in bad weather. and her food and water placed near her.
