





#### September

September has been through quite a few changes over the years. It was originally named 'Septem', meaning seventh month, by the Romans, but in 451 BC the months of January and February were added to the calendar, making September the ninth month. September also used to only have 29 days. Thanks to Julius Caesar's reform of the Roman calendar in 46 BC the month now has an additional day. Also, in the year 1752, the British Empire skipped 11 days of September, between the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> when we changed from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar.

Back in Anglo-Saxon times, September used to be called Gerst Monath, which translates into "barley month". It was the time of year that the barley

crop was harvested which was used to make a popular drink. It was also named Haefest Monath which translates as harvest month, when the farmers start to harvest their crops.



Some disastrous events have occurred in September.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1662, 'The Great Fire of London' started in Thomas Farriner's baker's shop in Pudding Lane. The fire swept through London for four days. It destroyed 13,200 houses, 87 churches, and even St Paul's Cathedral. Accounts from the time, state that only 6 people died but historians are not sure how accurate that is.

September 1st 1939, was a dark day for the world. It was on this day that Hitler invaded Poland, beginning World War II.

September 11th 2001, the worst terrorist attack on US soil happened, when four commercial airliners were hijacked. Two of the planes were flown straight into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center, and another was crashed into the Pentagon. The fourth plane crash-landed in a field in Pennsylvania.

Let's hope there is some truth in the saying, 'things run in threes,' and from now on, Septembers will be free from disaster.





#### **Kingston Lacy Estate News**

Phase two of mire restoration commences on Holt Heath National Nature Reserve

Mires are wet and boggy areas that typically form peat by the laying down of sphagnum mosses. Mires and other peatland sites (such as bogs, fens and wetlands) are internationally recognised for their ecological significance and are home to many interesting and rare insects, amphibians, reptiles, migratory birds and plant species.

On the eastern side of Holt Heath National Nature Reserve there is a 98ha (242acre) valley mire. This area is a site of special scientific interest (SSSI) and was deemed by Natural England in 2010 to be in an 'unfavourable' condition due to an extensive network of historic ditches that criss-cross the area because of historical peat cutting practices on the heathland. The ditch network causes water to run-off the heath resulting in the mire becoming much drier than desired, especially during the summer months.

Between 2016 and 2020, with the help and support of Natural England and the Environment Agency, we undertook phase I of mire restoration. This involved installing a series of plugs within the ditch network to slow the passage of water running off the heath and encourage it to flow sideways into the mire to form desirable shallow pools. We also installed monitoring equipment, cleared areas of vegetation and upgraded some sections of bridleway.

Following the success of the Mire Project, and Natural England advice, a second phase of works was identified to further enhance the mire. During this time The Dorset Peat Partnership was formed to investigate the feasibility of restoring degraded peatland habitat sites across the Dorset Heaths and to put forward plans to secure restoration grant funding from the Nature for Climate Peatland Grant Scheme. In August 2023 the Dorset Peat Partnership secured funding to deliver the capital works for peatland restoration across sixteen sites including Holt Heath.

Having tackled the larger ditches in phase I to create wetter site conditions, phase 2 now focuses on using the same technique as before on smaller peripheral ditches and clearing vegetation from key areas within the mire. This is to further improve both the hydrological and habitat functionality and quality, meaning better conditions for both peat to be formed and for the species that live there.

We plan to carry out the work between late August and early October, minimising disturbance to ground nesting birds whilst allowing the best access to the mire without causing excessive damage to the site. During this time there will be minimal disruption to access on the heath.

Starting with my usual opening sentence, the weather, which although has been a bit better, has still not been great at times. Despite this, I hope you have all managed to get out and about and enjoy yourselves.

We have still been having a lot of issues with damage to the playground, the Memorial Hall and the Football club property on Churchill Close. We do report any incidences that relate to Parish property to the police. If you see anyone damaging any equipment, please do report any incidents that you witness on 101 or online at Dorset Police Report a Crime. As a result of all these problems we wrote a letter to the Police and Crime Commissioner, and we have had a positive reply to try and assist with the situation. The issues have also been reported to the ASB officers at Dorset Council, and the Community Safety Officer.

We are actioning maintenance and repairs to the playground as advised in the Annual Inspection report. There is always work on going around the Parish with regards to maintenance of village seats and drainage ditches, for example. We report any other works that come under Dorset Council's remit, like vegetation that needs cutting back where safety is an issue. The Council pay for an extra verge cut in the autumn. Four 'No Horses' signs have been ordered for Churchill Close to remind riders that they are not allowed to ride on the Green to protect this valuable space and parishioners too.

The two VAS speed indicator signs on the A350 are due to be removed by Dorset Highways due to age. We are going to discuss with Dorset Council about placing a SID sign on the A350, although they have said they would not be appropriate within the village. We still need volunteers to come forward to join the Speedwatch team in the village, so if you feel you would be able to give time to help with this, please do contact the Parish Clerk, details are on the web site mentioned above.

The Neighbourhood Plan referendum took place on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2024. Do keep a look out for details of the results on the Parish website and social media.

The Plans for eight properties on the Churchill Arms site, and five properties at 97 / 99 High Street have been Passed.

### `For it's September, and I Haven't Got Time for the Waiting Game... \* - By Lys de Bray

Well, you have, of course - A gardener' year is packed with seasonal and essential tasks, so much so that he has hardly got time to lean on his spade to admire the results of last year's efforts. Gardeners live in the future - we sow seeds and wait to see them germinate, grow, flower and set seed and this 'waiting game' is a pleasurable time. It's also a time to experiment. For example, we generally plant spring-flowering bulbs round about now and the garden-centres are full of them now. (Try the market, cheaper and just as good) Once upon a time roses were bought and planted now, my father would order them in spring and expect delivery round about now or later.

Michaelmas Daisies - Aster novae-belgii family, are a huge group of delightful daisy-flowered perennials varying in size from about 6 inches to 6 feet. The single-flowered varieties are great for bees, so do plant as many of them as you can. Mostly, Michaelmas daisies are real toughies, thriving in almost any soil as long as they have sun. I once saw a sad sight; in a barren car-park at Wareham I saw a scattering of no-colour plants with no-colour flowers, and, curious, I went across to see what they were. Under the thick layer of dust they proved to be Michaelmas Daisies struggling for life. The car-park must once have been a garden because there were other 'gardeny' plants around, marigolds, a single unhappy hollyhock, stems of honesty and what looked like wallflowers. Had I had time, I would have dug them all up and given them a happier home (I always carried as sharp trowel in the car for such life-saving occasions. And in case you're thinking what I think you're thinking - no, I never dug up wild flowers. (I) it's illegal and (2) I grew them from seed anyway.

Clematis are another big group for this time of year. My varieties have large flat single flowers about 5/6 inches wide which are, alas, scentless, but their big flat flowers make a great impact. They, too, prefer a sunny position. There are several forms of clematis; *Clematis tangutica* 'Bill Mackenzie' has dangling 6-petalled yellow bells at this time of year, developing into balls of white fluff; these often happen at the same time as the flowers which makes it well worth having if you've only space for one plant. (C. t. 'Bill Mackenzie' can grow to a height of 20ft) Many herbaceous plants take up a lot of space just a-growing before they flower, but that's gardening.


