From The Church

Does God have a Sense of Humour?

Mark Twain, the great American writer and humourist is quoted as saying, "Humour is mankind's greatest blessing". I can't agree more. Fun and laughter really are a huge boost to our well-being and this is borne out in the medical world when they tell us that laughter is a strong medicine, triggering healthy, physical and emotional changes in our bodies.

These learned medical people tell us that laughter strengthens our immune system, boosts our mood, eases pain and protects us from the effects of stress. One of the positive effects of laughter that stands out for me, is that it helps to release our anger and forgive sooner.

As forgiveness is one of the tenets of our faith, it is clear to me that our God not only has a sense of humour but he is the source of all joy, fun and laughter.

Over the past few weeks I have been watching the Britain's Got Talent show on TV; the show gives people a chance to show off their talents (or lack of them!) and much fun and laughter permeates the show. The surprising winner of this year's show was a madcap Norwegian comedian named Viggo Venn, who had the audience in stitches as he ran wildly around the stage wearing a high viz jacket.

Nature's Voice

Well, summer is definitely here! I've currently got all the curtains closed, trying to keep the house cool!



July is a great time to spot stag beetles. Have you seen any yet? Here's one photographed by Beth Barker-Stock in her garden in Poole. The larvae feed on rotting wood, so it's a good idea to have a log or two in a corner of your garden. They are in their alien-like, grub form (think bush tucker trial on I'm a Celebrity, Get Me Out of Here!) for up to 6 years, before emerging in all their shiny, black, armoured, pincery glory for just one summer of romance, before laying eggs for the next generation, and then dying by the August! They are protected, and, whilst they may look a little scary to some, they can do you absolutely no harm, so please

admire them and let them be on their way. Remember if you find a big old whitish, yellowish grub, it might have been working hard for 6 years, so resist the urge to evict it from your garden too!

The lighter evenings give opportunity for more wildlife adventures, in fact, it doesn't seem to quite get completely dark at the moment! I was recently allowed to join a group looking for nightjars. These strange looking birds are rather special. They cut a fine, hawkish profile in the twilight and sport rather a smart, light-coloured band on each wing, which is visible when they fly. They make the most eerie long, drawn-out croaky call to let you know where home is. They need open heath land and are helped by conservation grazing on our protected heaths, by cattle, which stop the trees turning the heath into forest.

DORSET COUNCILLORS COLUMN

Here we are in July already, where has 2023 gone so far? However, I think my favourite month is June – season of salads, strawberries, Jersey royals, colourful gardens, often lovely summery weather as indeed we have enjoyed for the greater part of the year, and of course, not forgetting that great event, the Village Fete.

I had the pleasure of opening St. Mary's church fete in Sturminster Marshall held on 3rd June. This, to me, was a quintessentially English affair with all the right ingredients! Tombola stalls galore, bric a brac, books, a magnificent cake sale, model railway layout, children's games, and, of course, "splat the rat!" plus many more, with the highlight of the day being the judging of the 'make a crown' competition for the youngsters.

Through this column can I say a big thank you to the organisers and all who took part for their hard work in producing what was, certainly for me and my family who joined me later in the day, a really enjoyable experience. Also a thank you to the Red Lion for the delicious lunch and friendly service.

Local councils are never high in the popularity charts with many residents, but it is what we have at the moment. What came before was possibly even less so. I was reading an extract in the Minster Parish Magazine, taken from the Court Book of the Manor of "Wimborne late Deanery" 1624 - 1689.

The book, loaned to the Chained Library by the Dorset History Centre contains records of 114 different courts held between those dates. The courts were in practice presided over by the Lord's Steward, firstly by Thomas Barnes and subsequently Stephen Bowdidge during this period. The lowest level of royal court administered justice on behalf of the King in respect of minor offences and dealing with matters relating to local government. The records of offences offer a great insight into the area of Wimborne at that period. Some examples include:

- Violence: "John Barnes of Burfoote spilled the blood of Robert Pinson" March 1630
- Wandering Beasts: "Philip Mills was fined 2d for allowing his pigs to wander in the street" October 1633.
- Blocking roads: "Andrew Brewer for annoying of the way with hog's dung" September 1669.
- Offences against beer-selling regulations: "George Moone and Thomas Wills sold beer before the Aletaster had tasted it" April 1635.
- Officers failing in their duty: "Jacob Tilsed, who was elected at the last court as
 one of the constables of Wimborne, has refused and still refuses to be sworn into
 this office" April 1642.

And this is my favourite:

"We present the waywardens of the tithing of the Downe for not amending his Majesty's highway being in decay" October 1666.

Hopefully, most of these issues have been resolved, but sometimes looking at my inbox, I am not so sure!

Maybe we are not so badly off with our local council today – I will leave that for you to ponder.



Well, here I am again! Doesn't time fly! It seems like it was just yesterday that I was writing for the next month, but here we go again!

Last month I went to Wimborne Minster, as I have done for some time, in the evening. I would pick up a long standing friend from where I once worked with young lads. They were good days.

Well, back to the present. Two other people I know were at Evensong and after the service we had a chat and he said how many swallows there are round the usual places but not yet beginning to nest! There are a lot of old nests in our barn and I have been watching and hoping to see some signs of nesting but not finding any and I have not seen any house martins at all. We have had no rain either and so they will have difficulty finding any mud. I do miss them.

Also, there seem to be not so many animals about. I remember when Gordon was the pig man they would pick on the pigs backs taking away the fleas which bothered the pigs but were good for the fledglings. Maybe that is why there are so few insects around or is it our own fault as there are too many green fields around? Maybe we have to change!

When I was small Granny would feed the birds in the summer to help with the feeding of the babies. I do still feed them all the year round, but this year they have eaten a lot of seed and fatballs. I get robins, bluetits, and sometime bullfinches ,though I have not seen any at all. Maybe the farmers are changing the fields with other crops which are not so good for the birds. Going back to the swallows, when I used to sit outside in the early evening and watch them flying around and drinking from the pond, which needs cleaning out by the way!

They used to be here in big numbers but now they are very scarce. I wonder how long they will stay this year before flying back down to Africa.







Comments on the June Bridge from Bob Parke

Greetings from the Emerald Isle.

Railway memories of days long gone.

Lys de Bray's memories of war-time railway practice brought to mind my own experiences. At the time in question, I lived at Coombe Farm, and attended kindergarten school in Broadstone, on, if I recall correctly, York Road. The establishment was called Southlands (or something similar). Each morning I would be deposited at Bailey Gate station to catch a train to Broadstone. Initially I was sat in the last compartment nearest to the guards' van, under the watchful eye of a railway employee with whom my father was acquainted. However, after a few journeys it was decided that I could sit where I wanted provided I behaved myself!

On arrival at Broadstone I would get off the train and walk from the station at Dunyeats Road to the school, along the length of the main shopping street (Lower Blandford Road).

At the end of school-time I would walk back to the station, and return to Bailey Gate where someone was awaiting my return.

I have few other memories attached to this tale, except that I clearly recall that, provided I had the time and a few (old) pence in my pocket, I could obtain some sweets in a shop opposite the station entrance. I am sure it is long gone!

The year was 1955 and I was 7 years old. I doubt if my parents would be allowed to do this nowadays without being hauled before the local Magistrate. However, as my father, Capt. Richard Parke, was a Magistrate himself, perhaps it wouldn't have been too serious!

English Usage by Michael Evans

Michael seems to be labouring under the impression that the word "feck" no longer exists for current usage unless the suffix "less" is appended.

It is a well established fact that when speaking in what passes for English in Dublin and anywhere else in the world where the Irish diaspora foregather, the Irish use the word "feck" day and daily, usually as an euphemism for a well establish Anglo Saxon expletive. As a passing thought, "fecking" is also in widespread usage, usually for much the same purpose.

Wasps and Hornets by Lys de Bray

In the garden black and yellow stripes generally mean 'Danger - don't touch.' I'm thinking of wasps and hornets, of course. The subject of this little piece was triggered by the sight of an exceedingly large hornet flying lazily round the bedroom as if it owned it, which it did just as soon as I'd opened the windows wider and shut the door into the hall. We are all familiar with wasps and their black and yellow colouration; I saw this creature against the light-coloured ceiling and the warning stripes appeared to be black and yellow but were actually brown and yellow.

However, I wasn't mistaken as to its size. It was HUGE and on checking this later what I probably saw was a queen hornet, which is about two plus inches long. Truly.

Hornets and wasps have similar requirements as to nesting sites, usually choosing hollow trees to make their nests in. These are formed from chewed wood and are wonderful natural structures. Eggs are laid by the queen and these first eggs all produce female workers. At that time I had some wooden garden furniture and one sunny day I was having cup of tea and a slice of sinful chocolate cake, and a wasp landed on the table and began to chew away at it, and I could hear the rasping noise quite distinctly. I stayed still and listened and watched and marvelled. The wasp seemed to have chosen to work rather than enjoy the cake crumbs.

The chewed wood is mixed with the wasp's saliva to form the 'paper' that the nests are made of. Wasps feed their larvae on other insects, parts of these are chewed up for the purpose. For themselves they like ripe and overripe fruits which are rich in sugars, as is nectar and honrydew. Ivy flowers are visited in autumn and other flowers that are the 'right' shape for the worker-wasp's tongues. There is more to tell you about a wasp's life cycle and fill in some gaps next time. Lastly, if you get stung, apply bicarbonate of soda. If you get stung by a bee, check to see if it left the sting, if not dab with vinegar.

Ands now, as promised last month here are some buddleja varieties:

- B. davidiii: 'White Profusion': and B. fallowiana var. alba. have white flowers.
- B. *globosa* Orange ball tree, has sprays of orange bobbles, completely different to the typical buddlejashape. Great in flower-arrangements.
- B. davidii 'Dartmoor' has typical deep purple flowers. B. davidii 'Black Knight' deep violet- purple flowers.
- B. davidii 'Royal Red'- has twenty inch long plumes of deep red-purple flowers. `Nanho Blue' has very pretty pale blue flowers.
- B. 'Harlequin' has variegated creamy white leaves and deep red-purple flowers. For an arrangement I would cut off the purple flowers and put in some stems of a white-flowered variety which would look like white flowers on a variegated-leaved plant. This was many years ago and by now there may actually be such a plant with white flowers and variegated leaves. When I was growing buddlejas, I noticed that there were more butterflies on the white varieties which was really unexpected to see.
