

Nature's Voice

There's been a bit of warmth in the sun over the last couple of weeks – at long last! The fresh, green scent of cut grass fills the garden, while out on walks, it's the sweet-ish smell of cow parsley that billows from every roadside and path. The beans and tomatoes have been planted out, now that the risk of frost has passed, and the natural world is becoming very busy all around!

As beetles trundle over the heath and meadows, the kites and buzzards wheel, high on the warm air currents with the occasional prehistoric screech as they do so. Robins and blackbirds are brave in their industrious focus, almost oblivious to humans as they search for nesting materials and food. The sparrows are chirping tunelessly from what feels like half way through the night – a sure sign that summer is on its way!

A neighbour showed us a big slow worm just the other day! Bronze and shiny, they are a gardener's best friend, eating up all your slugs! Spare them a thought if you're strimming – have a good swish-about before you start, to scare them away. We found a common lizard basking in the sun at Badbury Rings recently too – the warmer weather is when you'll find reptiles and amphibians out and about.

Now is a great time to cater for nature when you're in the garden. Think about leaving a patch of longer grass, or go extend the whole 'No Mow May' if you dare! Plant native species, if you can, as these are the right size and shape for native pollinators to feed from. Look out for pests like aphids and give them a squish or find them a ladybird (they like them for tea!) rather than turning straight to pesticide sprays which are indiscriminate and harm all insects, not just the annoying ones.

I had a big birthday this week... (I'll let you guess which one!) and received, among other fantastically thoughtful things, the wonderful gift of a donation on my behalf to the Woodlands Trust which will help fund the protection of existing forests and also the creation of new native woodland. Such a lovely idea and I'm so lucky to have friends that 'get' what I'm trying to do and support that. Here's hoping it will help, not just the trees, but all the insects, reptiles, birds and mammals that rely on our woodlands to thrive – the cute ones and (my favourites), the scaly, slimy and buzzy, less appealing ones!







Kingston Lacy Estate News

A Year at Home Farm

It's hard to believe a year has gone by since I began as Farm Manager at Kingston Lacy, in charge of the estate's Red Ruby Devon cattle and Portland sheep (and the three pigs!). To say it's been a whirlwind would be an understatement but don't take that as a negative – I like to be busy and busy I have been!



My year began before I did, with a call the day before my official start date to rescue a cow stuck in a ditch at Holt Heath. This very much felt like a baptism by fire but I was heartened to see how readily the team pulled together to help get this poor lad out. Now nicknamed Bog Boy, the cow took a few days to fully recover but all is well now.

Ben Gruitt, Farm Assistant, and I started our tenure at the same time, taking a good look at grazing across the estate. We work not only in relation to the herd's goals, but also the National Trust's goals to provide species-rich habitats that are accessible to people and help restore the natural world.

This has led us to seek new areas for the stock – the sheep moved to Badbury to help us maintain the chalk grassland and for the first time we began our grazing aspirations at Bishops Court Farm. I am passionate about how the livestock can benefit the wider natural world, and look forward to sharing more on this in the future.

One highlight has been being able to out winter some of the cows for the first time in many years. I'm a big believer in cows being kept outdoors as it is so much better for their health. Winter grazing is also important to reduce grass growth, opening the sward for more delicate meadow species. Watching the park come back to life this spring has been a joy – the grasses look reinvigorated, and the wildflowers already look more abundant.

Only Connect - part 2

Last month I showed that FECK, HAP, RUTH and RECK have meaning only if we add the suffix –LESS. As I write we have all been able to enjoy a lovely weekend with sunshine and blue skies. Everywhere is looking so lush, and so green and summer is upon us. Before we know it, it will be time for summer holidays.

We are looking into planting a small group of three trees on the edge of Churchill Close in the autumn and have been getting advice from Dorset Council. These will be in celebration of the recent Coronation and the plan is for one of them to be an oak and possibly two cherries. The tree survey has been conducted and there are minor works required to some of the Parish Council trees. The new Gardening Group mentioned in last month's Jottings have been busy already and we are grateful to them for their hard work. It is not too late to join the group if you would like to, just get in touch with the Parish Clerk.

The Annual Risk Assessment has been completed and there are some minor action points, and by the time you read this the Annual Assessment of the Play Park will have been carried out. Recent works are now complete, but we are still looking into improving the area under the equipment to keep the children safe while playing. We are hoping to soon be able to place a bench that was in Bartons Ground, in Charborough Way green space, we are just waiting for confirmation about placement and fittings from Dorset Council.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group have been working hard on the Neighbourhood Plan and are currently finalising a draft version of the Plan for consultation. Please look out for the consultation which will start in mid-June and run for six weeks. There will be a drop-in session on the 6th July at the Memorial Hall (2-7pm) so the community can come and see what the team have been doing. All information will also be on the website and social media. Please fill in the questionnaire, as it will help shape the Parish in the future.







Buddlejas* - by Lys de Bray

ALCONT OF A CALOR

NEW AND

I was a war-time child and seemed to have spent quite a lot of time on trains, sometimes in curious circumstances. For example, children travelling alone would have a luggage label tied round their necks which had the child's destination on one side and on the other side the child's home address. Not many people had telephones in those days. In addition, for the child's safety, he or she might be put into the guard's van with the sliding doors firmly shut, or possibly, locked.... there must have been lighting of some sort? Writing this in today's world it's hard to believe – no, not just hard, impossible! But it happened to me once or twice, not often, it's true *but*! And some journeys were quite long ones.

I remember one station where there was a really long delay and the stationmaster there took me to his house where his wife was baking honey-cakes and she gave me some, wrapped in a little flowered napkin which I was to give to the station-master when I'd finished eating them. This was wartime, remember! Sweet things were in short supply but our teeth were good. At every station the guard would come and open the door to see if I was all right, was I warm enough, and did I need to go to the ladies? He took me to the station buffet, where there very long queues and nothing left but crumbs by the time you got to the counter. Because he was The Guard there were things under the counter though I'd told him I had sandwiches and apples and a precious little bar of chocolate which I had been told to keep till last, and all this as well as the still-warm honey-cakes. He made me a sort of bed on the big bags of letters he called mail-sacks.

Now you must be wondering what on earth has all this got to do with buddlejas,, or buddleias as the plants name used to be spelled. Well, when I see buddlejas in their long season of flower, I'm reminded of those train journeys because at some stations there would be the house where the station-master lived and the little gardens often had buddleja bushes in bloom, the 'ordinary' ones with the long spikes of purple flowers so beloved by butterflies. On railway embankments (they like good drainage) you will seldom or never see a 'wild' buddleja with flowers of any other colour than the familiar purple.

Many gardeners have a Butterfly Bush to guarantee a 'flutteration' (my new collective noun) of butterflies or even a hummingbird hawk-moth or two. Sorry, I got a bit carried away with war-time memories – other Buddleja colours and varietal names next time.

* The buddleja is named in honour of the Rev. Adam Buddle, a 17th century English botanist from Essex.
